## From the Pastor



I believe with all conviction that in every person is the need and desire to worship. This is part of our spiritual DNA from God. We will identify something or someone as the object of our worship, and what we choose will guide our life. Anything that becomes the object of our desire and what we worship is given the power to shape and lead our lives. We must choose faithfully, and we must choose deliberately our one, true Lord. As we enter the Easter season, my prayer is we will clarify that our God is the only part of our lives worthy of worship.

One faith-filled moment of worship and affection for the Lord can be found in the New testament shortly before the crucifixion of Jesus. Mary of Bethany, one of at least six identified people named Mary in the New Testament, demonstrated sincere worship of the Lord. In the twelfth chapter of John we read of a visit by Jesus to the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. These three siblings frequently hosted Jesus when he was in Bethany. The scripture reads that while Martha was preparing the meal, Jesus was sitting around a table with Lazarus, Mary, and other disciples. While they were seated, Mary opened a very valuable bottle of perfume, poured it on his feet, and proceeded to wipe his feet with her hair.

Although she drew criticism from Judas, the disciple who would later betray Jesus, Mary was steadfast. This was an extraordinary moment and one that continues to inspire us today. Mary was completely caught up in this moment of giving her affection to Jesus, not distracted or tempted to waver for any reason. Also, Mary brought to the feet of Jesus something of great value and gave it liberally. How are we, too, inspired by Mary? **First, we can live fully in the moment of our worship**, not wavering or distracted for any reason. We can worship with the conviction that there is no other earthly way to substitute or replace this time together with the Lord. Every worship time is an opportune time to grow deeper in our affection for our Lord and be led deeper in service to one another. **Second, we can bring to the Lord what is most valuable from our life**, remembering that as we bless the source of our life, so we are blessed. The spirit of God is among us throughout our days. We are privileged to be together during this holy season of remembrance, sharing in the rich glories of Christ Jesus our Lord.
